

Audi Club Sydney **Code of Conduct**

The following code of conduct is to be observed by members of Audi Club Sydney when participating in events organized by ACS committee and invitations from organisations such as CAMS or various car clubs..

We require all members to accept our Code of Conduct when attending any events ACS are associated with.

CODE OF CONDUCT GUIDELINES:

- Treat every member with respect, dignity, & courtesy regardless of the car they drive, his or her age, gender, ethnic origin, religion or ability. Any discriminatory practices (as required under our Australian Anti Discrimination Act) will not be tolerated
- Treat organisers / committee / officials with respect at all times
- Accept and abide to directives by the organisers / committee & officials to their requirements with due respect during an event where a member has acted inappropriately for use of bad language, verbal, physical, or emotional abuse towards any member or official
- Any member found to be contravening the Code of Conduct could be asked to leave the event they are attending if the issue is not resolved to the satisfaction of the officials running the event. Further action can be considered by the committee
- Must not partake in club events under the influence of alcohol (over the legal limit) or any Illicit drugs
- Must obey road rules as prescribed by relevant state or territory this includes:
 - No overtaking on double white lines or blind corners
 - No dangerous overtaking that could endanger oncoming traffic or other drivers
 - Tailgating on drives is forbidden. It is dangerous and Illegal (Rule 126 of road rules act) with a \$448 fine it represents 25% of all rear end accidents. We recommend min 3 seconds or 10 cars distance at speeds of 100 km/hr. Any member found to be flaunting this rule will be asked to cease this practice or asked to leave the drive
- All vehicles attending events must be registered, roadworthy, & insured with a minimum of 3rd party insurance
- Members should take responsibility for their own actions. ACS will not accept responsibility for the negligence or actions of any person or persons whatsoever
- Any speeding fines are at your own risk and not the responsibility of ACS
- When attending drives arrive with a “full tank” of fuel
- We ask that all cars have a CB radio (min 5 watt). This enables fellow drivers of impending dangerous road conditions or accidents etc
